This consists of two different policies for the resident Hall, and 15, 15 million for the dining hall. As we know the situation we have paused this project to see given the strength of the higher education we have had discussions internally if we chose not to build a residence hall, can we have other housing using other on campus and we can't do that. How the situation will to this that's my main thing to point out we have a couple of other projects in the list, a couple of infrastructure utility projects that you all have approved we will move and work on the shortly as you see tomorrow come the fine art facility rapidly underway, moving out really quick, we will answer any questions you have on specific projects.

I look forward to those they will be great and interesting. Both facilities but particularly the fine arts facility, going back decades on there. In the 1950s , we have seen some construction work any questions for Danny?
