Abstract:

A systematic investigative research project was designed to study the correlations between poverty, religion, and social conflict in the Middle East. The research points out uneven distribution of wealth as one of the central issues affecting poverty rates and social tension in Middle Eastern countries. The policies implemented by Middle Eastern governments are primordial to address this important issue. The policies should be designed to both sustain economic downturns and income distribution reform, in order to diminish the high rates of poverty and social conflict in this region. In addition, entire governmental systems in this area are at risk due to the persistence of these problems, along with religious conflicts. Assistance on regulation enforcement from international entities and organizations can mitigate these problems by provide prospective viable solutions without viable affecting political sovereignty and democratic structures.
