- Chairman Lackey called the meeting to order at 2:35 P.M. in the President's Suite of the University Center.
- Chairman Lackey wished the members of the Senate and visitors a Happy Valentine's Day and welcomed David Glazer, representative from SGA, to the meeting.
- The minutes of Meeting No. 199 were approved as written with the addition of the signature of the Senate secretary to the last page of the minutes.
- 4. Chairman Lackey reported that the Senate had received a "thank you letter" from Dr. Neal Houston expressing appreciation to the Senate for their support in his request for sick leave.
- Chairman Lackey expressed sympathy to Drs. Wilbur and Libbyrose Clark on the death of their son.
- 6. Chairman Lackey reported that the Presidential Screening Committee has completed the first phase of the screening process.

7. Officer Reports

A. Chairman Report

Chairman Lackey reported on the highlights of the meeting of the Board of Regents.

- * Approved funds for new mainframe for use by the academic component of the University.
- * The search of a dean of the Graduate School is on hold due to limited funds and the desire to allow the new president input in the selection of this important position.
- * The Graduate Council has recommended a graduate assistant orientation program to begin in the fall of 1990.
- * The Faculty Handbook is being revised and all Senate officers and committee chairmen have copies for review.
- * The final revision of the Institutional Self-Study is complete and a copy is available in the Senate office.

Chairman Lackey reported on highlights of the recent <u>COFGO</u> Meeting in Austin, Texas.

- Chairman Lackey and Chairman-Elect Mace attended the meeting.
- * "Winds of change are blowing with regard to faculty input into the governance of the University".
- * A report on faculty governance was given by a professor from Indiana who is reported to be an expert on faculty governance.

Chairman Lackey reported on his search for the answer to the question asked at Senate Meeting No. 199 regarding the existence of a Standing Rule which required that all Senate reports be read at the first meeting and that action on the report could not take place until the following meeting (second reading). Currently, no such standing rule exists.

^{*} Chairman Lackey thanked Chairman-Elect Mace for his report and for conducting the survey.

- * A discussion insued with regard to the procedure used in initiating and conducting the "equipment needs survey". Several senators expressed concern that the Chairman of the Senate requested the Chairman-Elect to conduct the survey without the knowledge or consent of the Senate.
- * Senators Smith and Shows suggested that perhaps a committee of the Senate should conduct an official study of the needs of the departments.

D. Representative to the Graduate Council

Senator Mitchell, Faculty Senate representative to the Graduate Council, distributed an outline of the recent activities of the Graduate Council. Recent activities of the Council are:

- * Requested continuance of the search for a dean of the Graduate School (delayed until next year).
- * Accepted plans for a three day orientation program for graduate assistants (on campus) beginning Fall of 1990.
- * Considering plans for the William R. Johnson Outstanding Graduate Thesis/Project Award.
- * Considering proposal for Master of Social Work.
- * Continue to act on the applications for renewal of membership to the graduate faculty.

Senator Mitchell reported that all members of the graduate faculty should be receiving copies of the minutes of the monthly meetings of the Graduate Council.

- Chairman Lackey introduced Vice-President James V. Reese to the Senate to report on the procedure for student evaluation of the faculty.
 - * Highlights of Dr. Reese's report
 - The evaluation instrument to be used is the same one approved several years ago by the Faculty Senate. Only coding and "information requested" has been changed.
 - The evaluation will be conducted once each year for every faculty member.
 - The department chairman is responsible for the evaluation process.
 - The chairman will designate the person to give the evaluation to a class. The evaluations will be sealed in an envelope and sent to the Computer Center.
 - A summary sheet and the evaluations will be returned to the faculty member.
 - A summary sheet will be kept by the Departmental Chairman.
 - The University will pay for the evaluation process.
 - According to a recent ruling by the attorney general, all evaluation summaries are a matter of public record and will be on file in the library.
 - The evaluations will be kept on file for a period of 3 to 5 years.

- * Senator Arscott asked if evaluations are to be conducted on the administrators. Dr. Reese replied that their are no plans to evaluate the administration.
- Laboratory classes will be evaluated.

Committee Reports

A. Election Committee

Chairman Frank Smith reported that he is in the process of determining how many persons need to be elected to the Senate. There is a question regarding the tenure of Chairman-Elect Mace, and if his position needs to be filled for the ensuing year.

Motion by Senator Smith: That the Senate membership remain at 25 and that the Constitution be followed with regard to the rotation of the membership and that the Chairman-Elect not be replaced until the completion of his fourth year.

Motion seconded by Senator Arscott.

Motion to table the motion by Senator Roberson.

Seconded by Senator Mace.

Motion to table the previous motion passed.

The Senate secretary will search the minutes and locate the motion/amendment pertaining to the election of a replacement for the Chairman-Elect.

NOTE: The following was located in the minutes of the Faculty Senate Meeting No. 193, March 8, 1989.

The Constitution of the Faculty Senate, Stephen F. Austin State University, shall be amended as follows:

Section 4. For the purposes of electing members of the Faculty Senate, the University shall be divided into the following groups: Applied Arts and Science, Education, Fine Arts, Forestry, Liberal Arts, Library, Sciences and Mathematics. Each group shall have at least representative: no department shall have more than t.wo representatives; apportionment shall be adjusted every three Representation from each group shall be determined by allotting to each group one representative for every four percent, or major fraction thereof, of the voting faculty the University. For the purposes of apportionment. allotment of representatives, for the academic year 1990-91 and thereafter, upon the Chairperson-Elect assuming the office of Chairperson, the office of senate from the group from which the Chairperson was elected shall be deemed vacant, and an election shall be held to elect an additional Senator from the group in question.
