

Report on Information Regarding Staff Compensation

Stephen F. Austin State University

(1) The number of full-time equivalent employees employed by SFA:

- FY2018 – 1,709.7

(2) The amount of legislative appropriations to SFA for each fiscal year of the current state fiscal biennium:

- FY2018 - \$40,145,767
- FY2019 – \$40,201,343

(3) SFA’s methodology, including any employment market analysis, for determining the compensation of executive staff employed by SFA, along with the name and position of the person who selected the methodology:

- The methodology for determining SFA’s executive compensation was determined by a Salary Equity Committee, appointed in 2001 by former SFA President Tito Guerrero. The committee recommended using the CUPA-HR Administrative Survey average of national public and private institutions in comparison to SFA’s executive salaries. This recommendation was accepted and implemented in 2002.

(4) Whether SFA’s executive staff are eligible for a salary supplement:

- SFA’s executive staff employees are not eligible for salary supplements.

(5) The market average for compensation of similar executive staff in the private and public sectors:

- Market data from CUPA-HR 2016-17 Administrative Salary Survey

- The average total compensation paid to SFA employees, excluding executive staff, for FY2018 was \$47,783.

- The following chart shows the percent increase in the average salary for SFA's executive staff in comparison to the percent increase in legislative appropriations for SFA during the past five fiscal years.
