- Note 1: Eight hours (two courses) from LSC Life & Physical Sciences Core
- Note 2: Three hours from LSC Creative Arts Core
- Note 3: Three hours from LSC Math Core
- Note 4: Three hours from Lang, Phil, & Culture; **BA degrees require an additional course from the Lang, Phi, & Culture Core with a different course prefix from the Core course taken; HUMA 1301 is acceptable for College Requirement**
- Note 5: **All BA degrees require foreign language proficiency through SFA level 232 (2312) of the same language (includes subjects FRE, GER, POR, SPA, SPH, numbers 131 (SPAN 1411), 132 (SPAN 1412), 231 (SPAN 2311), and 232 (SPAN 2312)**
- Note 6: Three hours from LSC Social & Behavioral Science Core
- Note 7: HIST 2321 or HIST 2322 can be taken at LSC as electives and substituted for either HIS 161 or HIS 162 in the major
- Note 8: **Both GOVT 2305 and 2306 should be taken at LSC to satisfy Government/Political Science Legislative & Core requirement.**
- Note 9: Six hours from HIST 1301 (HIS 133), HIST 1302 (HIS 134), or HIST 2301 (HIS 2---)
- Note 10: **A maximum of 66 hours of academic courses plus up to 4 hours of PHED/KINE courses from community colleges can be applied in a bachelor's degree**
