## EARLY MODERN LONDON: From Chaucer to Shakespeare



### ABOUT THE CLASSES

The program will immerse students in the material environments of major early modern English authors. Courses will meet at SFA at the beginning of the Summer I session. The group will leave for England on **June 18** and return on **July 2**. Students may contract to substitute ENG 315 or ENG 412 for ENG 348; or ENG 326 or ENG 436 for ENG 390.

**Activities:** Lectures in Nacogdoches, walking tours of art and architecture in London, pilgrimages to Canterbury and Stratford-upon-Avon, performances in London and Stratford.

**Visits will include:**

**London:** Tower of London, British Museum, St. Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, the Globe Theatre, the National Theatre, and other

sites in Southwark;

**Canterbury:** Canterbury Cathedral, Mercery Lane, St. Augustine's Abbey, and Norman Castle;

**Stratford-upon-Avon:** the Royal Shakespeare Company theaters, Shakespeare's Birthplace, remains of New Place, Hall's Croft, Holy Trinity Church, and nearby Warwick Castle.



# BUDGET AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Students must have a valid passport no later than **February 15, 2010.**

Applications should be filed before **Christmas 2009**

## Cost of the Program

The trip is **estimated** to cost \$3,600 (**does not** include the \$75 application fee, tuition or books).

The cost includes:

- Roundtrip airfare from Houston
- Health insurance while abroad
- Lodging with breakfast
- Ground transportation within and to and from London
- Many admission fees and theatrical events

## Scholarships

The SFA Office of International Programs (OIP) offers a \$500 tuition scholar-

ship to undergraduate students with a 2.5 GPA or higher who were enrolled in the previous semester at SFA. Students must fill out the scholarship section in the program application. A copy of your current transcript must be attached to the application.

## Installment Plan

Participants may pay by check or credit card. The full amount may be paid at once or distributed over 5 installments based on the following schedule:

- November 15 \$500
- December 15 \$775

- January 15 \$775
- February 15 \$775
- March 14 \$775

## Spending Money

Students should budget approximately \$600 for meals, souvenirs, and so forth.

# HOW DO I REGISTER?

**Step 1:** Download the Faculty-Led Program Application Package from the OIP website, complete and submit to OIP, LAN Room 402.

**Step 2:** Begin trip payments on November 15, 2009.

**Step 3:** Apply for passport.

**Step 4:** Once passport is received, provide Inés Maxit at OIP with two photocopies of the first two pages.

**Step 5:** Attend travel and course orientation sessions in Spring 2010.

**Step 6:** Register for ENG 348.090 and/or ENG 390.090 for Summer I during usual pre-registration period. (Students seeking to earn credit for a particular course—ENG 315 for ENG 348, for instance—will be required to sign a contract prior to the beginning of Summer I.)

**Note:** Enrollment limited to 15 students in each course. First ones to pay \$500 deposit are eligible.
