6. Fiscal year budget for FY23

We will present our collective budget to UBC based on what we need to thrive, if that means there needs to be more i.e. advisers etc., put in the request. We may not get everything we ask for but please put in the request. There is pressure on the university to

have a budget in line with our priorities.

There are temporary savings available, we have set aside about \$2 million for deans and directors to fill interim positions, this is a significant amount of money available. Money has been awarded to the AARC for tutoring and for t-shirts, also to International Programs for more scholarships.

Dr. Darville asked if some of these one-time savings could be used to assist with job searches, bringing candidates to campus.
