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Notes and Comments:

- 1 Social work majors are required to complete 1 semester of Human Biology as a SWK program requirement from TJC BIOL 1408, 1409, 2401,2402, 2404 or from SFA BIOL 1308,1309 or 2301. If Human Biology is not taken in the Science Core, it will be required as an additional program or major requirement. It is best to take Human Biology as one of the Life & Physical Science Core courses and one other TJC Science Core course to meet the Science Core and to avoid taking additional science to meet the program or major requirement for Social Work.
- 2 Students who are core complete at TJC may take an elective. Students not core complete will take an additional communications course for Core Requirement I (Component Area Option - 090)
- 3 A maximum of 66 hours of academic courses plus up to 4 hours of PHED/KINE courses from community colleges can be applied in a bachelor's degree. If a student is Core Complete at Tyler Junior College, they are Core Complete at SFA – if Core is not complete at Tyler Junior College, core must be completed using SFA's requirements.
- 4 Students will be required to repeat the following courses when the grade is below a C: ENGL 1301, ENGL 1302, Human Biology, and all SOCW Courses. A minimum of 30 semester hours of work must be completed at SFA, of which at least 30 hours must be advanced. Contact your SFA advisor for alternative courses to the core courses listed.
- 5 SFA offers a variety of courses during the summer parts of term in addition to the fall and spring semesters listed above.
- 6 Fall and spring semesters offer courses in a 16-week format, with select courses also available in an 8-week format.
