# **CLINICAL TEACHER INFO SPRING 2020 & COVID - 19**

Currently have 231 clincial teachers  
TESTING INFO To DATE

114 have passed the PPR exam

2 attempted w/o passing PPR

117 have not passed

Testing Centers are closed --when and if they open there will not be enough centers for all EPP testers in the state to complete testing immediately --we cannot recommend them until all tests are passed



# POSSIBLE WAIVERS?

- EPP ADMISSION?
  - GPA IS 2.75 (TEA REQUIRES 2.5)
  - DO WE NEED TO DROP TO A 2.5 FOR AN ID WINDOW OF TIME?
- MAINTAINING GOOD STATUS W 2.75 GPA?
  - WILL GPAS DROP DUE TO COVID –19?
  - DO WE NEED TO DROP TO A 2.5 FOR AN ID WINDOW OF TIME?
- PASSING TESTS IS A BENCHMARK IN OUR EPP IN MULTIPLE PLACES
  - CLINICAL TEACHERS MUST PASS CONTENT TEST IN ORDER TO CLINICAL TEACH (YET CENTERS ARE CLOSED)
  - DO WE NEED TO WAIVE TESTING REQUIREMENTS FOR FALL 2020?
