### **Diversity of Placements**

AFI From NCATE: The unit does not ensure that all candidates have field experience and clinical practice with P-12 students from different socio-economic groups, and diverse ethnic/racial groups, and English language learners and students with disabilities. (ITP) (ADV)



### **Diversity of Placements**

- Live Text Field Experience Module (FEM)
   Qualtrics, data management tools, allowing
   the unit to document and track initial and
   advanced candidate placements.
- Elementary and Middle Level Grades programs in Field I, Field II, and Clinical Teaching
- Secondary and All-Level Field I, Field II, Field III and Clinical Teaching.
- Advanced Level this includes tracking placement sites for internship or practicums.

### **Diversity of Placements**

### Diversity Ratings Based on State of Texas Averages

A placement earns 1 point if:

Special ED> 8.91%,

A placement earns 1 point if

Economically Disadvantaged >58.95%,

A placement earns 1 point if

ESL population > 18.77%,

A placement earns 1 point if nonwhite > 71%

A placement earns 1 point if>30% Male or Females

1-2pts = Not diverse, 3-4 pts = Moderately Diverse, 5-6 pts Highly Diverse

### Three cycles of data from F18, S19, & F2019 revealed

 74%-80% of all advanced program placements were rated Diverse to Very Diverse

 77%-79% of all initial level field placements were rated Diverse to Very Diverse

 73%-79% of all clinical teacher placements were rated Diverse to Very Diverse



### Three cycles of data from F18, S19, & F19 revealed

- As candidates move through their progression of field experiences, they are all placed in settings that allow them to experience at least one Diverse to Very Diverse K-12 setting.
  - The Elementary and Middle Level Grades programs have two field experiences prior to clinical teaching. One field experience consistently includes at least 90% of placements at Diverse to Very Diverse placements.
  - The SED program has three field experiences prior to clinical teaching with all three of those placements with no less than 86% of placements in Diverse to Very Diverse school settings.




Fall 2020 Clinical Teachers (CT) Content Testing

Secondary and All-Level







#### PEC Issued GPA Waiver

- Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 applicants were issued a waiver to the 2.75 GPA requirement
  - Applicants can be admitted with a 2.50 GPA
- Cohort GPAs Must be a Minimum of
  - 3.0 (Reported to TEA and CAEP)
    - All admitted candidates are included in the cohort GPA calculation
      - Undergraduate initial
      - ACP
      - Non-teacher

Year	Number of Admits	Cohort Overall	Cohort Last 60 Hours
2019-2020	734	3.24	3.37
Post-Waiver (5/1/2020-1/21/2020)	493	3.26	3.34

Note: Out of 493, 70 (13.4%) have been admitted to the EPP with less than a 2.75 GPA. The average GPA of the 70 is a 2.62.



### **TEA-Test Approval**

Test Approval for Returning Finishers

- TAC 228.40 effective October 15, 2020
  - An EPP may require candidates to complete additional coursework to prove preparedness for a certification exam if:
    - The candidate is seeking test approval in an area where the standards and/or test changed since the candidate completed the EPP; or
    - If the candidate has returned to the EPP for test approval **five or more years** following the academic year of completion.



## **TEA-Test Approval**

#### **TEA Clarification**

• If a candidate does not fall into these two categories and is a finisher of the program, then the EPP must provide the candidate with test approval. If the candidate is not a finisher of the program or falls into one of the two categories above, then it is per the discretion of the EPP to add coursework/training to grant test approval for the candidate.



## TEA – Test Approval

- SFA EPP test preparation/remediation policy for candidates in the following two categories:
  - The candidate is seeking test approval in an area where the standards and/or test changed since the candidate completed the EPP; or
  - If the candidate has returned to the EPP for test approval five or more years following the academic year of completion.

Prior to test approval, finishers must meet with the program coordinator and/or program testing coordinator to determine whether coursework and or training will be required.
