Stephen F. Austin State University Teaching Excellence Award Criteria & Selection Procedures

Original Implementation: February 2007

Last Revision: September 2020

Each unit in the Perkins College of Education (PCOE) will select a unit recipient and will forward the recipient's name to the Associate Dean's office.

To be eligible for the PCOE Teaching Excellence Award, a person must:

- 1) Be a permanent, full time faculty member
- 2) Have at least three completed years of experience at SFASU.

The PCOE Teaching Excellence Selection Committee includes a representative (unit head nominated) from each unit. In determining the PCOE Teaching Excellence Award recipient, the PCOE selection committee will use the SFA Teaching Excellence Award Criteria.

Eportfolio: For consideration, nominees must submit their Teaching Excellence Award materials via an electronic portfolio using the Livetext template.

The eportfolio should contain the following elements:

- 1. Cover (Name, Department, Date)
- 2. Teaching Philosophy (2 double spaced page maximum)
- 3. Faculty Activity Reports (summary report of last 3 academic years)
- 4. Summary chart of course evaluation results for the last 3 academic years
- 5. All Course Evaluations including scores and comments (last 3 academic years)
- 6. Evidence of Meeting Set Criteria (videos)
- 7. 1-page letter of support from a Chair/Director
- **An academic year is considered September 1st-August 31st

Evidence of Teaching Excellence Videos:

- 1. Each unit representative should provide a video (maximum of 5 minutes) explaining and showing evidence (artifacts within the video) of each of the seven components listed on the PCOE Teaching Excellence Award: Evidence of Teaching Excellence Rubric (page 5).
- 2. Each unit representative should upload all seven videos to the LiveText template by designated date on the first page of this packet.
- 3. The associate dean will evaluate the teaching videos but will not include a rubric evaluation as part of the overall evaluation unless there is a tie.

NOTE: The teaching portfolio will count for 60% of the total score while the remaining 40% will be the teaching videos. The evaluation sheets will **NOT** be distributed to nominees.

PCOE SFA Teaching Excellence Award Portfolio Criteria

Characteristics of Effective Teachers

For each criterion provide an artifact and an explanation of how the artifact demonstrates mastery of the criterion. Artifacts may include summaries of course evaluation comments or ratings, examples of course materials, photographs, etc. Keep in mind that it is better to *show* the committee what you do/have done to demonstrate each of these things rather than *telling* them that you do it.

A. Individual Teaching:

- Well organized instructional materials from courses (lectures, assignments, etc.)
- Interested in students as individuals
- Sensitive to the physical and social learning environment of the classroom
- Innovative instruction
- Effective teaching as assessed through peer and/or alumni evaluations
- Promotes tolerance to meet the needs of all students
- Commitment to continuous improvement of their own classroom teaching

B. Contribution to the teaching of others

- A commitment to continuous improvement of teaching within their department and/or within their college (e.g. mentoring, collaboration within department or College of Education, etc.)
- A commitment to continuous improvement of teaching within the university (e.g. teaching excellence center involvement, collaboration outside College of Education, etc.)
