Possible Prompts...

- identify key lesson topics discussed
- briefly discuss learning strategies utilized
- summarize learning "take-aways" in 6-words or less
- sketch a visual to cue lessons learned or to demonstrate understanding
- ask a lingering question regarding course content/vocabulary

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Why it's great for STUDENTS...

✓ to demonstrate to themselves and their instructors what learning occurred / *did not* occur during each class meeting

✓ to briefly document class learning for *future* studying reference

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How INSTRUCTORS can use it...

- daily submission for **class engagement points**
- as an **attendance check**
- as a “**spot-check for completion**” throughout the semester
- to prompt **student-led review of / discussion about previous learning** at beginning of next class period
- as **student-made study guides** for exams
- to prompt summative course discussion ... so that they remember all the **AWESOME** stuff you taught them before course evals ;-)

Final Tips...

...prompts can be revised to match the content of the day or can remain static to establish a “routine of reflection”

...for online courses
