• What is it?

 A shared online document through which students can collaborate and then showcase their work

How is it useful?

- When you want students to have a collaborative workspace for reflecting, planning, writing, and then sharing with peers (5 minutes - weeks)
- In-person, livestream, and even fully online courses

1. First Slide:

a. What is expected? Introduction, directions, links to resources, etc.

2. Rest of Slides:

- a. Duplicated single, pairs, or sets of slides so that each group may select their own
- b. Each set should have:
 - i. A different background color
 - ii. Space for students' names at top
 - iii. Any type of workspace!

Sharing with Students

1. Get the link:

- a. In your document, go to File -> Share -> Change
- b. Set to "Anyone with the Link" and also "Editor"
- c. Copy the link

2. Share the link:

- a. <u>F2F</u>: Share a shortened link with <u>bitly.com</u> or <u>tinyurl.com</u>
- b. Zoom: Paste full link in the chat
