1. Introduction

Thank you for your interest in pursuing a graduate degree in education at Stephen F. Austin State University (SFASU). We offer several exciting and innovative graduate programs that prepare teachers for careers in the secondary school setting. By exploring the roles of teacher as researcher, scholar-practitioner, student-advocate, and community member, our Master's Programs cultivate a learning community of faculty and students through dialogue and critical inquiry.

While graduate programs can be designed to meet students' individual needs, most students choose one of the following two degree plans for the Master of Education:

Master of Education (M.Ed.) Degrees

I. Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Teaching and Learning (36 hr.)

This program is designed primarily for experienced teachers who wish to further their education and improve their teaching practice or for teachers who wish to qualify for leadership positions within their schools or districts (i.e., curriculum/instructional specialist).

Students in this program will all take an 18-hour core, which will provide them with the knowledge and skills to better serve the needs of the diverse EC-12 student population in Texas. Beyond the core, <u>students will choose from three tracks</u> (i.e., ESL/Bilingual, Online Teaching, and Gifted/Talented) in which to specialize and will be able to choose 6 hours of electives from inside or outside the College of Education to further expand their knowledge base.

Students in this degree program will complete a capstone project in conjunction with a 3-hour graduate course (SEED 5395).

II. Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Content Area Minor (18/18)

This 36 hour program includes 18 hours in secondary education (SED) and 18 hours in the student's chosen teaching field. The degree is aimed at students that wish to teach at a community college and/or for high school teachers who wish to teach dual credit courses. Other important details about this degree plan:

This degree cannot be done in conjunction with the teacher certification sequence.
 They are two separate degrees. If you are interested in certification, please see the MAT Handbook.

- You must take 18 hours of 500-level coursework in a second content area. All 18 hours must come from the same secondary content area. For example, you cannot take 6 hours from three different content areas.
- Students in this degree program will complete a capstone project in conjunction with a 3-hour graduate course (SEED 5395).

2. Admission Process

M.Ed. Programs

Admission Requirements:

- Completed Bachelor's degree from an accredited university
- Minimum cumulative grade-point average of 2.5 and a grade-point average of 2.8 on the last 60 hours of undergraduate coursework (on a 4.0 scale)
- The GRE is not required

If you are interested in applying to this program, please follow these steps:

- Apply online to the <u>Graduate School</u>. There will be a \$50.00 application fee charged to your account at SFASU. The Graduate School will calculate your GPA to determine eligibility.
- 2) Choose Master of Education in Teaching and Learning if you want to complete the degree with the specializations/tracks. Choose Master of Education in Secondary Education if you want to complete the 18/18 degree.
- Receive an acceptance or denial form and degree plan from the corresponding department.

Additional Admissions Issues:

Application Deadlines

For a Fall semester start: August 1 For a Spring semester start: January 1

For a Summer I start: May 15

Admission Status

You can be admitted in two different ways:

- 1. Clear this means you have no conditions imposed on your admission; this is the admission status you want.
- 2. Probationary You may be admitted on a probationary basis if your GPA is below the minimum. In this case, you have one semester to bring your GPA up or else you will not be allowed to continue taking classes. Being admitted on a probationary basis may keep you from receiving financial aid. Transfer credit

If you have taken graduate courses at another university, you may be able to transfer those credits to your degree plan at SFASU. Please order an official transcript and have it sent to the Graduate School. In addition, please send copies (unofficial is okay) to seed.med@sfasu.edu for evaluation.

Completion timeline

You have <u>six years</u> to complete your graduate program. Courses that were taken more than six years prior will not count towards your degree plan. Please plan accordingly so that you can graduate within the six year window.

Meningitis vaccination requirement

4. Registration & Advising Procedures

Secondary Education graduate students do not need to be formally advised. See Section 4 of this handbook for the courses you should take. If you have an extenuating circumstance, contact the program advisor at seed.med@sfasu.edu.

Once the course schedule for an upcoming semester becomes available, you log in and register yourself for the courses you need. For summer and fall semesters, the course schedule typically becomes available in April. For spring semester, the course schedule typically becomes available in November. Please register as soon as you can so that we can plan appropriate.

5. Official Program Assessments

The Secondary Education graduate programs use the LiveText data management system to collect critical assessments for students who are Perkins College of Education majors (undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral) or majors in other colleges seeking educator certification through the Perkins College of Education. Students who do not have an existing LiveText account will receive an access code via the SFA email system within the first week of class. You will be required to register your LiveText account, and you will be notified how to do this via email. If you forward your SFA e-mail to another account and do not receive an e-mail concerning LiveText registration, please be sure to check your junk mail folder and your spam filter for these e-mails.

If you have questions about obtaining or registering your LiveText account, call ext. 1267 or e-mail SFALiveText@sfasu.edu. Once LiveText is activated, if you have technical questions, call ext. 7050 or e-mail livetext@sfasu.edu. Failure to activate the account and/or submit the required assignment(s) within the LiveText system may result in course failure.
