1. Chairman Ford called the meeting to order at 3:15 p.m.

2. Minutes of Meeting No. 58 were approved as corrected.

3. Report of Officers:
Chairman Ford requested that written copy of motions and resolutions presented to the Senate be given to the secretary to insure correct inclusion in the minutes.

4. The treasurer, Jess Richardson, asked that charges to the Faculty Senate Account go through the secretary or chairmen of the individual committees.

5. Dr. Ken Watterston, Chairman of the Faculty Government and Involvement Committee submitted a list of Faculty Senate representation for 1975-1976 (see appendix.)

6. Dr. Wayne Johnson informed the Senate that the Student Affairs Committee is preparing a list of members for attendance at the Student Government meetings.

7. Dr. Bennat Mullen, Chairman of the Administration and Financial Committee presented a progress report concerning the topic of merit raises, accountability, and development of objective criteria for faculty pay raises.

8. Dr. Franks moved that the Senate be polled as to the type of system of pay raises they preferred: A. Merit raises B. Across-the-board C. Combination of merit and across-the-board. The majority of the senators preferred a combination plan; there were no votes for (B).

Dr. Franks moved that two committees be appointed to formulate alternate proposals to the merit plan designed by the committee.

- 9. Dr. Mullen reported that procedures to select a search and screening committee will be initiated upon receipt of the Board of Regents invitation to participate.
- 10. Dr. Kobert Carroll, University Physician, requested that the Senate make recommendations concerning University Health Facilities. The Professional Welfare and Student Affairs Committees were appointed to study this matter.
- 11. Dr. Pat Russell requested that the Senate study fringe benefits for the faculty. Chairman Ford referred the request to the Professional Welfare Committee.
- 12. Dr. James Garrett introduced into discussion a request that the Fiscal Affairs division of the University be studied concerning its relationship to the faculty. Jerry Vincent was asked to chair an ad hoc committee to study this matter. (See appendix 2)

 13. Dr. John T. Lewis discussed with the Senate the rationale for the proposed merit system for pay raises.
- 14. President Steen addressed the Senate concerning faculty salaries for the 1975-76 year. The average faculty salary was up almost \$2,000, with the average faculty salary being \$16,808.

Note: Education is under-represented by one senator Liberal Arts is over-represented by one senator Representation should be: one senator/16 faculty members (actually - 1:15.84 - However, .84 got rounded up in the administration) We recommend that the Faculty Senate undertake to study a part of the University that has a profound effect on the primary aim of the University, which is the education of students. We refer to that division called (in the Organizational Chart on page 9 of the Faculty Handbook) Fiscal Affairs.

Fiscal Affairs includes:

Business Manager Fiscal Office Purchasing Agent Director of Plant Maintenance

Moreover, we recommend that this study include a survey of the Faculty and Department Heads to determine if other than we few have problems with carrying out our educational aims because of the operation of this division.

We request that this study be made for two reasons. One is that we may do what we can to help this part of the University to be more efficient in working toward the common goal. Too often Fiscal Affairs does not seem to be aware of that goal. Secondly this suggested study should be made so that the faculty will be better informed on the problems of the Fiscal Affairs area and therefore better able to interview candidates for the presidency of Stephen F. Austin State University.
