#### **Campus Recreation | Student Center Grand Ballroom**

All majors in the College of Sciences and Mathematics are encouraged to take the one-hour introductory course to explore teaching risk-free in a supportive environment. The VRC is a hub for programming efforts that can include connections with faculty and staff and access to resources provided by the university and outside agencies.

The Pre-Health Professions Program provides guidance and resources for students planning to apply to professional health programs after graduating from SFA. Students interested in the following health care pathways are encouraged to attend: Pre-Medicine, Pre-Dentistry, Pre-Physician Assistant, Pre-Physical Therapy, Pre-Occupational Therapy, Pre-Pharmacy, Pre-Optometry and Pre-Veterinary.

#### **Joint Admission Medical Program | 1:30 to 1:50 p.m. ONLY Miller Science Building, Room 139**

The Joint Admission Medical Program is an undergraduate pipeline program created by the Texas Legislature to close the gap between participation and success for economically disadvantaged Texans pursuing their dreams of becoming a doctor. Pell-Grant-eligible students interested in medical school are encouraged to attend.
