

Dead Week

Original Implementation: June 16, 1982

Last Revision: April 20, 2021

Dead week is an established tradition in higher education to allow students the necessary time to prepare for final examinations. During the last five class days of each long semester, written examinations (except to cover daily assignments) and themes or assignments beyond normal daily requirements are not to be assigned without written notification to the students prior to the twelfth class day.

The Division of Student Affairs and university sponsored student organizations shall observe dead week by refraining from sponsoring events during this time. All student organizations shall be unable to reserve on-campus facilities including use of university grounds for events or for the purpose of advertising events during dead week. Student organizations may not advertise on or off-campus events through any campus medium during this time period.
