JURISDICTION OF NACOGDOCHES.

Goods That they Possess and with what Permission They Have Them

A log house on Lot 10 vs. Front (Torn)
possessed without judicial document and only with permission of
Don Bernardo Fernandez when he was Commandant in this post,
said Lot (Torn.)

A log house on Lot 30 vs. front and 100 depth, had from Jose
Sanches of this vicinity by informal sale and (torn)
has given 20 vs. to his sons-in-law Joaquin Montes and Juan Bel-
anche for houses, said Lot was granted by Capt. Juan Cortes to
Sanches.

A log house on a Lot 60 vs. front and 84 in depth, which was
granted to his mother Rita Bergara by the Captain Don Juan Cor-
tes; he has two mares, three cows and three oxen.

A log house on a Lot 30 vs. front and 53 in depth; he had it
from the citizen Manuel de Acosta, contracted informally to said
party, which was granted to him verbally by Captain Don Antonio
Gil Ibarvo; he has 4 horses, 1 mare, 2 oxen and 3 cows.

A house on the bank s of Ayish Bayou on land of his father-in-
law Edmund Quirk, who had it by sale authorized by Lieut. Don
Miguel Musquiz; has 37 cattle, 8 horses and 61 hogs.

On which he has a log house with corn field and fruit trees, is
enclosed by log fence; which land is one league to the north,
another to the east, and to the west 200 vs. and to the south
three-fourths of a league, inherited from his parents who had
it by sale authorized by Capt. Don Juan Cortes; has 29 cattle
17 horses, 2 yoke of oxen for carts.

Two log houses for residence; one that covers a grist mill, an-
other for granary and two for his negroes, on land consisting of
a league and a half front and same in depth, granted by Lieut.
Don Jose Ma. Guadiana, on which he has a field and summer pas-
tures; he has 26 horses and 26 head of cattle.

A log house on Lot 63 vs. Front and 32 depth bought from Juan Es-
parza by informal sale, and he also has on the Ranch named San
Jose a long house; the land of said Ranch consists of one-half
league to the west, half a league to the east, and on the North
bounded with land of Capt. Don Antonio Gil Ibarvo, who had it
by informal sale from Dimas Moya, who before that possessed it
as settler and asked possession of it of Capt. Don Juan Cortes
and it was not given to him, and instead to the said Garza.

Captain Don Juan Cortes; and said Posos has a log house.

A log house; the land is one league in each direction of north,
west and south, and to the east 300 vs., for which land he has
no judicial document and has possessed it with verbal permission
of Capt. D. Anto. Gil Ibarbo; has 5 cattle, 7 horses and 20 hogs.
He has 5 cattle, one mare and 2 oxen.

A log house on a lot of 20 vs. front and 20 depth; is part of
one lot that was granted to his mother M^a Andrea Chirino by
Captain Don Juan Cortes.

Is from his father-in-law Mepomuceno de la Cerda on which his has is residence and corn field.

A log house on Lot 40 vs. front and 42 depth, had in informal sale from Juan Ig^o pifermo. Another log house on a Ranch that he has on land of half a league in three directions on Carriso Creek had on possession granted by Capt. D. Juan Cortes on which he has a field and 3 horses, 7 mares, 1 jack-ass, 18 head of cattle and 4 oxen besides.

A log house in which he lives and another which serves as a granary; the land consists of tw leagues to the north and two to the west, and on the east bordering with land of ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ Mandano Sanches, and to the south a league and a half bordering with land of D. Bernard d'Ortolandt; he has a fenced field in which he sows a fanega of corn; 40 cattle; 45 horses; 5 yoke of oxen for carts, and 15 hogs; he also has a log house in this village on a Lot 40 vs. front and 40 depth had in informal sale from Teresa Rolet.

Mora to whom it was given in possession by D. Juan Cortes (torn)

A log house on Lot 55 vs. front and 60 depth (torn) inherited
from his grandfather D. Anto. Gil Ibarvo without papers 2 cattle

A log house on a Lot 30 vs. front on West and slopes to East to
4 vs; this land was verbally conveyed by his grandmother Juana
Bautista Acosta who acquired it by informal sale from citizen
Juan de Acosta and his in same manner had it from Mariano Sanches
to whom it was given by his father Juan Jose Sanches to whom Don
Antonio Gil Ibarvo gave it as a settler without judicial document;
he has 1 cow and 2 oxen.

Log house and corn field on Edmund Quirk's land bought of D. Pedro
Buigas, sale authorized by D. Miguel Musquiz; 30 cattle, 8 horses and
19 more; 13 hogs and 2 oxen.

he has 7 log houses. He has another lot of 40 vs. front and 58.4
depth on which is a stone house, and in the neighborhood of this
he has other land of 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ vs. front and 11 depth, all had from D.
Anto. Gil Ibarvo by sale authorized by Capt. Don Dionisio Valle.
A ranch named San Patricio on the banks of the Angelina River,
on which he has his field, and horses, cattle and hogs; the land
consists of 5 leagues square, had by sale authorized by Lieut. D.
Jose Maria Guadiana, and the cattle amount to 300 head and the
droves of cattle to 115 small and large. On the left bank of the
Sabine a place known as Santa Maria Adeleida (or Las Hormigas)
he has land amounting to 6 leagues square, had from the citizen
Jacinto Mora by sale authorized by Capt. D. Dionisio Valle, on
which he has a drove of cattle of 36 mares for breeding mules.
On the place La Naña, between the Arroyo Hondo and Sabine he has
another piece of land of 4 leagues square granted by D. Jose M^a
Guadiana in 1779, on which place he has had planted in corn and
milk cattle. He has also in this village a piece of land which
has a front of 55 vs. and depth of 100 had from Christoval Soto
by verbal sale and said land was granted to the mother of Soto
by Capt. D. Juan Cortes. He also has a piece of land on the border
of the village consisting of 800 vs. depth and 500 front had as
from the property of Luis Belanche who died while trading with

 Indians and owed the Trading House 1400 ps., and it received in payment said land by judicial document. He states that the lot was given in trade to Jose Zepeda who had before acquired it verbally, to whom it had been granted by Capt. D. Juan Cortes. A log house on Lot 30 vs. front and (torn) had been granted to his father Jose del Rio, decd. by D. Ant^o Gil Ibarvo (torn) material of his house from his bro.-in-law (torn) Also a piece of land which his father asked next to (torn) Cordova and Pedro Padilla of Capt. D. Juan Cortes and not (torn) of it and has cultivated it without knowing the number of varas of which (torn.)
 A log house, his field for planting corn and beans, the land is from his mother-in-law Teresa Mora; he has 15 cattle, 8 horses and 19 hogs.

A log house with a piece of land of two lots and a piece that includes 272 vs. front and 273 depth had from D. Vicente Micheli by sale authorized by Lieut. Don Miguel Musquiz on which he plants corn and wheat. On Durazno Creek a piece of land was granted to him by said lieutenant for summer pasture, which consists of one league in each direction; he has 2 horses, 10 mares, 1 cow, 4 oxen.

A log house on Lot 100 vs. front and 160 depth had in informal sale from Don Jose de la Bega, and he in same manner from Isabel Padilla, to whom it remained from her husband, Melchor Morin and was granted to him by Don Juan Cortes.

A log house on Lot 50 vs. front and 75 depth; said lot her husband Gregorio Soto inherited from his father, to whom it was granted verbally by Capt. Ant^o Gil Ibarvo. She has a ranch named La Coja, which land is one league in each of three directions and one-half to the west on which she has a log house and raises corn, and said land was granted by Don Juan Cortes.

A log house on Lot 60 vs. depth and 40 front granted to his father Joaquin Cordova by Capt. Juan Cortes. On Lanana Creek a piece of land planted with a fanega of corn; this his father had without document, with verbal permission from Capt. Gil Ibarvo and thus kept it. Has a share in pasture land, being from his mother Juana M^a Sierra granted by said D. Juan Cortes, sold in authorized sale by D. Miguel Musquiz to D. Vicente Micheli on condition that his children may pasture their animals there; he has 18 cattle, 13 horse. He has no other goods than the right which his brother Jose Cordova has in the pasture above stated. He lives on a house and lot of Don Jose de la Bega, who in informal sale had from Villalpando and he acquired it in possession from D. Juan Cortes; is 50 vs. front and 25 depth.
