Information for <u>PLATE</u> for the <u>John Barry Henderson House</u>
Located about six miles north of Marshall on Hwy. 59

John Barry Henderson acquired the property in 1868 on which was a two story structure (date unknown) it is the present rear wing of the house and served as a way-station on the stage route from Shreveport to Daingerfield.

Henderson added the main structure of the present house. The ground floor has thick walls of native iron ore stone (adze marks are clearly visible) and the second story is of frame construction with narrow clapboards.

The architectural style suggests a Spanish Monterrey influence. Porch columns are square and small extending full two stories in height. The most interesting feature is the second floor porch which is cantilevered.

Now owned and occupied by Mrs. R. H. Wood, Sr., a grand-daughter of John Barry Henderson.

John Barry Henderson was born in South Carolina May 26, 1817 In 1841 he married Nancy Berry. They lived in Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Henderson was living in Arkansas during the Civil War period. There from his farms he furnished beef cattle to the Confederate Army.

Two sons were in the Confederate Army:

Major Wm. B. Henderson, First Arkansas Infantry (1861-5) James N. Henderson, Corps of Engineers (3 years)

In 1867 Henderson moved to Titus County, Texas, and acquired lands there and in Harrison County in 1871 He moved to his Harrison County home

John Barry Henderson died in 1902 (age 85) and is buried in the Woodlawn Cemetary not far from his home.
