Dear Mrs. Keefe:

Enclosed herewith please find my check in the amount of \$15.75 to cover the cost of the medallion as indicated in your letter of May 12. I note that you are holding my check for \$27.50 previously sent you to cover the cost of the plate.

Your letter of January 16 states that you are in receipt of my application on the Patillo house, which I believe should be called the W. P. Lane house. It is true that as stated in my application for the medallion the house was owned by Patillo, for whom Patillo crossing on Trammel's Trace at the Little Cypress Bayou is named; but the house was later owned by General Walter P. Lane for a much longer period of time. He bought it for his sister but retained title to the property. General Lane figures much larger in Texas history than Patillo, being a veteran of San Jacinto, the Mexican wars, the Indian wars, and the Battle of Mansfield in the Civil War. It was he who brought back the bodies of the men who drew the black beans at Mier and had them buried at La Grange, Texas. I would suggest therefore that we call this old brick house the W. P. Lane house and the inscription should possibly read:

One of the oldest brick buildings in Marshall, built about 1856 by
William Patillo.

I trust that this information together with my application and the enclosed check will prove sufficient to process the historical marker.
