# Our Story

Millard's Crossing Historic Village was created by Nacogdoches native Lera Millard Thomas, wife of former Congressman Albert Thomas. Beginning in




Mrs.Lera Thomas established Millard's Crossing in 1970.

1970, Lera Thomas embarked upon remarkable this project, relocating a variety of historic structures from Nacogdoches County to family property north of town. She then had them restored and furnished with her extensive collection of artifacts and antiques. named her village

"Millard's Crossing" after the train crossing that passes on the north side of the property. Today the Village stands as a testament to one woman's determination to save what she could of "the oldest town in Texas."

Millard's Crossing Historic Village is unique for its number and variety of 19th East Texas buildings open to the public. No where else can visitors find so many log structures dating back to the 1840s, including a classic "dogtrot" home, a log school house and a log office. Visitors can also tour a rare two-story "double-house" built during the Republic of Texas days along with three other late 19th century homes. One of the most appealing structures to young and old alike is the pre-1920's wood caboose, which was once a part of the Nacogdoches & Southeastern Line.


